

Introduction and Welcome

I will always continue to allow anyone in the world, here or not, to take part.

This venue is liked by so many, so let's continue marching on.

I would have loved to have kept the seller's and buyer's fees at 10% no VAT. I'm sure you would agree that was devastatingly cheap and had a real edge when you see what is on offer at these events. But with time restraints as well as costs, I find myself having to now raise it to 15% no VAT. I am still far better value than mainstream and other rural houses, so I hope you'll forgive me for making this small change to ensure these events can still be held and enjoyed - it costs me over £2000 to put an event on, before stepping onto the rostrum.

I continue to be moved by your well wishes due to my health concerns at present. At times it is very scary, but the love and support from my dear family and friends keeps me on the rails. Also, this auction has certainly kept my mind on things other than hospitals. Prostate cancer is not something I wanted to start a fight with at 46. But with the amazing skills of the NHS, that fight will be made smoother. As well as my brain being poisoned by Pink Floyd and real ale, it seems the body is not far behind.

Very best of bidding luck with this 184-lot auction, enjoy yourselves and I look forward to welcoming you to this Mechanical Music Auction and Social-Meet event. Bring a van – you'll need one...

There is also a top-to-bottom hole through the base at the back with exit underneath, so it may well have been a table lamp – which makes sense if on the desk of a hotel or other such establishment. Although I've heard of them, I have never seen one. Quite a piece.







Following what appeared to be a de-gunk and re-grease job, it was handed back to the family in early 1962 once the vessel had made port.

The whereabouts and reasons for the lack of case is not totally clear as Daphne acquired this superb movement as-is. Comparing close serial numbers from this maker as listed on the MBSGB register which has casework descriptions/photographs, it would have been a plain affair with rounded edges and if embellished in any way, would have been simplistic inlay to the lid centre, or a thin crossbanded/strung framed border; perhaps both.

It is only possible to reveal the tooth replacements if a laser pen is shone across the surface of the comb – they are totally unseen by the eye or with a loupe which should of course give a clue as to who did this amazing work. And yes, all are perfectly tuned - if I hadn't have checked with the laser, I would not have known.

This is a rare opportunity to admire and fully view a very fine overture movement from all sides without hinderance, in addition to enjoying the specific notional qualities connected with this format – plenty of very tight and elaborate phases which are faithful to the score with noted feeling, refrain and pace. Note the specific arrangement of *Tancredi* which focuses on the counter-melody from the half-way point.
