#### A rare late 19<sup>th</sup> century glass harp,

With the 27 ground-tuned graduating diameter crystal glasses covering two octaves bridging middle C, each with short stem mounts to pine rack, § glasses marked with paper labels as front row, with the # and b glasses completing the keyboard layout behind as the back row, hinged centre opening to long row, folding to fit within the period pine case with hinged lid (lowest note glass cracked but glued) - rack when opened to play 60.1/2in. (54cm) long, largest glass 4in. (10cm) dia., the smallest 1.3/4in. (4.5cm), the carriage case 32in. (81.5cm) wide.

#### Est: £200-300

**Footnote:** Not to be confused by the glass harmonica, which consists of a horizontal rack of overlapping glass domes mounted on a revolving central pole, this glass harp is the ground-glass type which does not require the glasses to be filled with water to tune them. With constant moistened fingers, the player is able to use friction against the rims to excite the glasses to resonate which reveals their unique pitch to the ear. Sometimes also called Ghost Fiddle, Verrillon or Singing-Glasses, the glass harp was invented by Irishman Richard Pockrich in 1741, who used wet sticks against the rims in order to play. Later, the German inventor Bruno Hoffmann perfected the arrangement for the glasses to be mounted on a resonant rack to be played with fingers. Some musical artists have incorporated this unusual if not rather beautiful instrument into their work, such as Pink Floyd on their 'Wish You Were Here' album (1975) and Peter Gabriel on 'I/O' (2023).



#### AUTOMATA AND SINGING BIRDS

#### A very rare seated knitting harridan automaton, by Adolf Muller,

German, circa 1895, same as Model 265, 'Vieille Tricoteuse', by Roullet & Decamps, with papier-mâché head and hands, seated in stained beech spindle-back chair, with needles and blue wool-work creation between curled fingered hands, black wig, red patterned throw over long pleated fringed black dress, white cotton apron, when actuated the eyes open with a piercing stare before eyelids close as she nods her head up and down, whilst hands turn realistically in a knitting motion, black finished shaped baseboard, start/stop to her back, keywind entry to side – 20.1/2in. (52cm) high.

**Footnote:** Reading references: Ernst Holweissg Nachf (reprint of the 1898 catalogue) for Muller's work; Automata – The Golden Age, 1848-1914, C. Bailly, 1987, p. 302 for R&D work. This German maker is not usually seen, as his work was nowhere near the same output as the classic French makers from the 'Golden Age', despite working at the same period from circa 1891-1915. Best known for his exceptional facial characteristics using larger figures. Have you ever seen the film 'Don't Look Now'? The woman in the red coat.....boo!

#### An unusual Doll on Tortoise-back automaton, probably by Roullet & Decamps,
